Weekly Summary

Day 63 of the 105 day Regular Session.

Last Wednesday at 5:00 pm was the cutoff for bills to pass out of their house of origin unless they were necessary to implement the budget. The next cutoff for bills is March 29th for bills from the opposite house to pass out of their policy committee.

Activity on Priority Bills / Issues of Interest

HB 1786 & SB 5573 Increasing membership of the State Interoperability Executive Committee. (Support)

Both bills passed out of their policy committees without any opposition and are now in House Rules. **Update: SB 5573 passed the Senate on 3/6 49-0 and has been referred to the House State Government Committee. A Public Hearing & Executive Action is scheduled for 3/17 at 10:00 am. APCO will sign in Pro on the bill!**

HB 1284 Creation of a statewide school emergency panic button program.

This bill failed to pass out of the House Education Committee and is DEAD.

SHB 1258 Travis Alert

The bill is in House Appropriations and has been scheduled for a Public Hearing on 2/21. It has also been scheduled for Executive Session on 2/22. Passed out of the House Appropriations Committee on a 32-1 vote. The bill is now in the House Rules Committee.

Update: Passed out of the House 97-1. Was referred to the Senate Law & Justice Committee.

SHB 1418 Establishing a blue ribbon panel on cybersecurity.

Passed out of House Committee on Technology and Economic Development on 2/14. Referred to House Appropriations. Public Hearing scheduled for 2/22. Bill was scheduled for Executive Session, but it did not come up for a vote prior to cutoff. DEAD

SSB 5545 Collective Bargaining

The bill passed out of Senate Commerce and Labor on 2/15 and was referred to Ways and Means. The Substitute removes the requirement for meetings to be open. A requirement is added for public employers to submit current written proposals every two weeks until an agreement is adopted. The proposals must be made available to the public. Also public employers are to prepare a fiscal impact analysis of any final collective bargaining agreement. Passed out of Senate Ways and Means on 2/21. The bill is now in the Senate Rules Committee. **SSB 5545 is still in Senate Rules. It failed to pass the Senate prior to cutoff so it is technically DEAD. Since the bill addresses Collective Bargaining, there is a chance it could be resurrected at a later date!**

HB 1951(House companion bill) never received a public hearing and is DEAD. These bills are divided on party-lines.

Summary: Addresses the recommendations of the sunshine committee with regard to disclosure exemptions for the following under the public records act: (1) Investigative records compiled by an employing agency conducting an investigation of a possible unfair practice or a possible violation related to discrimination, however, once the agency has notified the complaining employee of the outcome of the investigation, the exemption no longer applies; (2) Proprietary data, trade secrets, or other information submitted by a vendor to the department of social and health services for the development, acquisition, or implementation of state purchased health care; (3) Trade secrets; and (4) Bids, quotations, or proposals submitted to an agency for goods or services in response to a solicitation issued for the goods or services but only until the agency announces the apparent successful bidder or decides not to accept bids, quotations, or proposals. Authorizes the court, in an action to enjoin disclosure of financial, commercial, or proprietary information, to award attorneys' fees to a defendant to the extent that the defendant prevailed in opposing an injunction.

Summary: Revises the public records act to improve public records administration. Requires training for records officers and public records officers to address particular issues related to the retention, production, and disclosure of electronic documents. Requires the attorney general to establish a consultation program to provide information for developing best practices for local agencies requesting assistance in compliance with the public records act. This program ceases to exist June 30, 2020. Requires the state archivist, until June 30, 2020, to offer and provide consultation and training services for local agencies on improving record retention practices. Requires the division of archives and records management in the office of the secretary of state to: (1) Establish and administer a competitive grant program for local agencies to improve certain technology information systems for public records; (2) Conduct a study to assess the feasibility of implementing a statewide open records portal through which a user can request and receive a response, relating to public records information, through a single internet web site; and (3) Convene a stakeholder group to develop the initial scope and direction of the study. Requires the county auditor to charge a surcharge of one dollar per instrument for every document recorded. Requires the joint legislative audit and review committee to conduct a review of the attorney general's consultation program, the state archivist's training services, and the local government competitive grant program. Makes an appropriation from the general fund to the secretary of state solely for purposes of the study.

Requires Washington law enforcement agencies to report to the office of the attorney general, certain information regarding each incident where: Deadly force is applied; and force is applied if death or great bodily harm results. Requires the office of the attorney general to compile and publish the data collected and ensure that the reporting is likely to comply with pending federal use of deadly force reporting standards. Creates the jail accreditation project to incentivize jails to seek and receive accreditation to improve the safety and welfare of correctional officers, inmates, and the public. Creates the law enforcement accreditation project to incentivize law enforcement agencies to seek and receive accreditation. Requires the department of commerce to administer the community and law enforcement partnership grant program to build and foster relationships between the community and law enforcement. Requires the Washington State University division of governmental studies and services to conduct a study on how to increase diversity in law enforcement agencies in this state. Requires the criminal justice training commission to: (1) Provide enhanced leadership training with the purpose of fostering agency culture that enhances internal legitimacy and, by extension, external legitimacy with the community; (2) Develop and offer advanced training for commissioned officers; (3) Expand advanced firearms training; and (4) Make efforts to provide enhanced crisis intervention training for at least fifty percent of full-time general authority Washington peace officers assigned to patrol duties. Creates the public safety enhancement account.
